## Headwater at BEDFORDLANDING

Then there's the master bedroom, a quintessential retreat with its romantic marble fireplace, vaulted ceiling, his and her walk-in closets, and sumptuous ensuite warming bare feet with its luxurious radiant in-floor heating.

With the Melanson family taking possession of the show home in December, and with five more homes to sell, interior designer Florano and her team have moved the Cape Cod-inspired furnishings to lot 11 this week – and invite curious show home connoisseurs to check it out.

With flourishes of Cape Cod style, Florano chose bare wood floors with minimal accent rugs, added a few nautical accessories and went with classic white upholstered furniture with the intentional use of patterns and prints on the toss cushions and accent chairs for visual interest. Consistency of wood finish in the choice of espresso toned coffee table, bar stools and cabinets complements the white and blue scheme in the great room.

## Dining Room DILEMMAS?

Interior designer Cynthia Florano is quick to identify her favourite furnishing in the Headwater show home.

"The round dining room table – it seats eight comfortably and creates a formal space for milestone celebrations and events!"

If you're shopping for a new dining room table, you may be pondering whether to go round, square or rectangular? First consider the shape of your dining area, as well as how large a group you usually seat around the table.

- » Rectangular dining tables are most common and complement similarly shaped dining rooms, yet can feel makeshift and cold if you are seating only two or three people.
- » Square dining tables, like the one used in this show home, look best in square shaped rooms and provide intimacy and a satisfying solution to seating a small number of people. We loved how the designer tricks the eye by placing the chairs "around" this square table for a dramatic effect.
- » Round tables are possibly the best shape for small gatherings as everyone can see everyone else and it creates a cosy and intimate setting.
